Standing Orders Resumed

2266/17 COUNTY, DISTRICT AND PARISH COUNCILLORS' REPORTS

- a) County Councillor Ford reported that DCC had jetted the blocked gully on Milton Road, however Councillors reported there were still problems on the south side of the road, near Clayfields. County Councillor Ford would ask DCC to make further investigations.
- b) County Councillor Ford had also raised the issue of speed calming measures on Milton Road. Due to the good safety record of this road DCC had no plans to instigate further traffic calming measures at the present time, but would monitor the situation. County Councillor Ford also highlighted the Trent Barton consultation on the Villager V3 bus route. He would also check that this was still on their website.
- c) Regarding The Dales site in Repton, County Councillor Ford advised that it was probable that DCC would sell the site for development.
- d) District Councillor Stanton advised that a Woodville Bypass would be funded by monies from transport regeneration; however there were no funds for a new river crossing in South Derbyshire.
- e) Councillor McArdle reported a successful litter picking event and a second event was planned before the summer. Reports of bonfires at the allotments had been received and allotment holders would be reminded that this was against the rules.
- f) Councillor Lloyd reported problems with the play equipment on The Mitre Field and thanked those responsible for the litter picking and also suggested that it would be helpful if householders could pick up any litter close to their properties. Councillor Lloyd also thanked DCC for fixing the light on the Cinder Track.
- g) The Chairman said that emergency repair work had been carried out on loose tiles on Broomhills Pavilion.
- h) Councillor Shortt reported repeated problems with the litter bin at Robins's Cross not being emptied. SDDC had advised that an operative had been absent, however they would audit all litter bins and check on any problem areas.
- i) Councillor McGahan advised the meeting that the six new trees for the Arboretum had now been allocated.

2267/17 CLERK'S REPORT

a) Annual St Wystan's Clock Service Offer

Smith of Derby Ltd were offering a 10% discount, together with no further price increases, with a fixed term contract for the servicing of the church clock.

RESOLVED: The Parish Council would enter a 5 year contract at a total cost of £801.00 + vat.

b) Open Gardens 2017

The Open Gardens event in Repton would take place this year on the weekend of the 17th and 18th of June.

2268/17 CHAIRMAN'S ANNOUNCEMENTS

There were no Chairman's Announcements.

2269/17 RECRUITMENT OF NEW COUNCILLORS

Councillors wanted to raise awareness of the vacancies on the Parish Council and the role of becoming a Parish Councillor, the next full Parish Council election being in May 2019. An article would be placed in the Jottings in The Parish Magazine, highlighting the role of Parish Councillor.

2270/17 REQUEST FOR GRANT FOR BUS SHELTERS AT WILLINGTON

The request for financial assistance was towards two new bus shelters at Willington. The total cost would be £12,000.00, Willington Parish Council were being asked to pay £6,000.00

Councillors reported that Repton residents had requested a bus shelter on the south side of the road, which would enable them to wait for a bus after attending the Doctors' Surgery in Willington, the nearest surgery for Repton residents. It was estimated that approximately ten percent of local residents would benefit annually from this provision.

RESOLVED: A S137 grant of 25% of the cost of the shelter on the south side of the road in Willington, to a maximum of £1500.00 would be made. The Clerk would ask when the shelter was to be installed and for final costings before the grant would be made.

2271/17 PROPOSAL OF FURTHER REBUILDING GRANT FOR REPTON VILLAGE HALL

The Repton Village Hall Company had circulated a progress report and updated financial information prior to the meeting. The Clerk had also provided Councillors with an updated financial report and estimated year end figure. Councillor Thompson requested a presentation by the Village Hall Company at a future informal meeting. Other Councillors agreed. The Chairman proposed a further grant of £10,000.00 this financial year on the same terms and conditions as previously stipulated.

RESOLVED: To make a grant of £10,000.00 for the sole purpose of rebuilding or renovating Repton Village Hall. The monies to be kept in an account separate from normal income and expenditure and work to be completed and funds expended within 7 years of the date of the agreement, or the funds returned with accrued interest. An agreement would be signed by both parties.

2272/17 NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN PROGRESS REPORT

Councillor Thompson reported that the Plan had now reached the final stage of public consultation before it is formally submitted to SDDC, prior to independent examination. The consultation period ends on the 20th of March. A positive response had been received and it was intended to submit the Plan to SDDC at the start of May. A local referendum would then take place.
